The warm colours of a hobby shop were inviting and piqued my curiosity right away as a refugee from the cold commute I would regularly undergo, and as such I would spend a few minutes to make a quick pit stop and buy a pack, or at most 2 packs of Pokémon cards. During this time, there were of course issues with supply as what would be expected in a still assist.



production to be scaled up to meet demand that came to a degree out of nowhere, but it largely did not take a long time for this to settle and with prices

stabilizing and products stocked on shelves. At first glance you might assume to a degree that this is what is happening now as well, that a rekindled interest in collecting Pokémon cards have driven prices sky high and left basically every local card shop, from the large chains to the more common mom and pop shops bone dry. But I am telling you, it is not. There is more interest once again,

with a previous versions of the same idea existing all the way back to the very start of the franchise in 1998 when a digital version, very aptly titled, Pokémon Trading Card Game released in Japan, and consistently new versions of this same idea have come to market in Japan, North America and elsewhere since. The issue however stems from the fact of the modern climate of social media. I don't need to really lean into the hows and whys of the fact that everyone understands that we are generally more glued to our phones than ever, and how we behave generally with trends, huge peaks and bigger falls. This of course happened with the new

Pocket app, as when it was released it has seen a good steady increase in user activity much to the pleasure of the companies involved. Of course this is going to drive customers to likely also hop over into the physical TCG, but the fact that stores are completely sold out and no one for their life can buy cards currently can not be explained by this surge, already accounted for by the Pokémon Company, so what does?

Surprise surprise it is influencers, or at least in part. Pokémon cards have fallen prey to quite literally

a bull market. When card prices started going up in 2021 thanks to Paul, online card sellers saw a good increase in profits as the trend soared and adults would pay several months of savings to get a single piece of nostalgia. There is a crucial note to make here, that the online card stores

here, that the online card stores that got a tidy profit were largely just online presence of existing in person stores. While of course some online only stores did exist, a huge majority were just another revenue stream for mom and pop shops to earn a bit of extra cash before the 2021 craze. This is where things differ so greatly to today. In the years since, outsiders saw the money to be made on the reselling of old cards along with reselling new cards to the emerging class of new collectors who continued beyond a temporary interest. These online stores started being able to sell individual high worth cards for record numbers, even while the sets themselves were still in print runs. Cards like the



It's often hailed as a timeless classic or whatever. According to the Rotten Tomatoes critic consensus it's a "warm, insightful, and very funny look into the inner lives of teenagers". With those expectations in mind, my boyfriend and I decided to watch it over the holidays. All in all, it wasn't terrible, but I just don't think it lives up to the hype.

I will give The Breakfast Club some credit. It was somewhat novel for its time and it had female leads #girlboss. It also explored themes that hadn't been covered and showed the world that *shocker* people are multifaceted. By having characters that were all distinctly different, most people could relate to at least one of them and people love when art imitates life. It showed the world that teenagers are more than just sterotypes, they also have complex thoughts and emotions, setting the stage for the movies that followed it. The soundtrack, acting, outfits and cinematography were all pretty good or great. All in all, the movie does have merit.

But despite that, I still am not convinced that the movie as a whole stands up to the test of time. As well, although it was one of the first few movies that tackled these subjects, there's a ton of books with similar themes that were around long before The Breakfast Club. The Catcher in the

Rye, Lord of the Flies, The Outsiders and The Bell Jar all tackle similar themes while remaining relevant to this day but I digress. Perhaps I just don't understand the movie but by today's standards it seemed like the characters lacked ... depth. They never really defy the stereotypes they were based on, which makes it difficult for the message to leave an impact. The idea that underneath the facade there's some shared humanity is something Jesus could tell you and the execution of it in The Breakfast Club seems shallow at best.


I just struggled to get the vibe they were going for. Like with Allison you're telling me that makeover was supposed to be this huge breakthrough? I can understand what they were going for, trying to represent how her character has changed and grown more confident but the lack of depth they afforded her character made it difficult to see it that way. Rather, it feels like she is simply made pretty and palatable and all her problems went away (what's with movie makeovers taking away the black eyeshadow? Kinda fucked up if you ask me). Not to be an armchair psychologist or anything but it seems like girl has got some genuine mental health struggles that are probably not going to be solved by a white dress, makeup and a boyfriend. But then again, one can never underestimate power of movie magic.

I can understand portraying the characters as their archetypes at the beginning of the movie, but like I found the characters to be lowkey annoying. I guess I should cut them some slack since they are high schoolers but I just didn't really find any of them ... likeable? I'm not saying that makes the movie bad, I understand what a character study is, but I just found it difficult to get invested while watching it when the leads could be insufferable at times. Despite their annoying nature at the beginning they ... continue to

be annoying? The characters don't really undergo any sort of personal change. This makes sense, they've only spent a day together. But if this is the case, why does another Rotten Tomato critic review say "Who would have thought that the John Hughes classic The Breakfast Club would still be Hollywood's best attempt at understanding and then destroying stereotypes?". WHAT STEROTYPES DID IT BREAK? Maybe I just lost the plot but it seems like no one ended up differing from the stereotype they were embodying in any sort of tangible way.

I also feel like the movie spent a bit too much time on weed-hunting montages. The pacing kinda feels off at times as well, with there being a lot of long, drawn out scenes that aren't really neccessary. I will admit that I have TikTok rot brain but just because the students are bored that doesn't mean I have to be. One of the most interesting things imo was the constantly INSANE moves being made by the teacher. WHY IS HE FIGHTING WITH THE KIDS? Is he not above it? or learning at any point, it seems like he just continually lashes out at other people unprovoked. His whole "redemption" at the end of the movie feels kind of unearned because of this.

Ultimately though, I think most of my qualms with the movie isn't due to the movie itself but the expectations I had of it going in. What may've been groundbreaking at the time now comes off as surface-level. The characters don't evolve in a way that makes them feel fully fleshed out. Additionally, I'll acknowledge that since the Breakfast Club was one of the OG high school movies, many of its tropes have shown up time and time again, so what was at the time novel now seems outdated. It's not necessarily the movie's fault that its influence has been recycled so much that it feels cliché in retrospect. However, that doesn't change the fact that watching it now, without the nostalgia factor, makes it harder to appreciate its originality. I get that maybe it was a cultural milestone at the time, but now is a new time and I think since then a lot of better movies have come out. The Breakfast Club was by no means a bad movie, but in an era where we have Ladybird, Mean Girls and the Perks of Being a Wallflower, The Breakfast Club feels shallow by comparison. While The Breakfast Club helped pave the way for these narratives, it ultimately feels like a relic of its time, not something that I see myself rewatching over and over.


I CAN'T DRAW



ago, the four nations lived together in harmony or something like that, but the only important one that we're gonna talk about today is water. Now, water is very important, but not all water is made equal. Now you're probably wondering, where would one go to get the best possible source of water while studying, between classes, or when loitering somewhere in Mackenzie? WELL do I have the article for you?

During Christmas break, I did the best family activity I could think of — testing each and every water fountain in the Mackenzie building, putting mine and my parents' health at risk to serve the public with this informative article. We went through each block of each floor and I will share our findings so that you mustn't also suffer through the many subpar water fountains.

Our first encounter in the 2100 block was what I believe (after looking at way too many water fountain pictures) to be an Elkay ezH2O® RetroFit Bottle Filling Station Kit for EZ Family Filtered Non-Refrigerated for the top part and bottle filler, with the bottom being an Elkay Wall Mount ADA Cooler, Non-Filtered Non-Refrigerated Light Grey Granite (I now keep getting ads EVERYWHERE for those exact parts

because of how much Googling I did). We knew this was a great idea when we entered the block to see a red filter status for our very first fountain. My father was the brave soul who tried it first, describing the water as "tinny and tepid". My mother followed that up with a similar sentiment: "It's not cold, I like it cold". This first fountain was very warm and the stream went way too far. My father did however like the airplane posters behind it, bumping up its rating to a 3/10.

The 2200 block had nearly the exact same setup, however this one was non-filtered. The stream on this fountain was inconsistent depending on which push bar was pressed, however it was cooler than the first fountain and didn't taste too bad. Overall, 6/10. The 2400 block was identical in looks, but had a good consistent stream, was slightly cool, and not a great taste. My dad noticed that it was "right beside a waste water poster which isn't appealing" and my mom noted that it was "still better than the first one", which is not a hard bar to beat. 4.5/10.

Onto the third floor, the first block was once again a letdown. Along

with every other fountain on the third floor, it was the exact same nonfiltered model. It was very warm and just all around disappointing. "Wouldn't drink that unless I was really thirsty" -my dad. 3.5/10. The 3200 block had a weak stream, but at least it was kinda cool, "better" as my mom put it, thinking of all the very warm fountains we'd drunk from thus far, 5/10. Now the 3400 block had a very nice stream, with my dad proclaiming "hohooo there's a good stream!". It tasted pretty good for once but wasn't very cold, 7/10.

The fourth and fifth floors were a bit different. The models of the 4100, 4400, and 5100 blocks were

hard to determine as there are no brands or model names on them at all, however I believe it's the same model as the 2nd floor of Snyder Hall at the University of Minnesota. The 4100 and 4400 fountains were the exact same. Frigid, refreshing, ice-cold water, absolutely no stream. Just a small dribble from both. "What little water there is appears to be very cold, but alas". 4/10 for both, at least they're cold. 4200 was once again the usual model, you only got a decent stream when pressing

one specific push bar, it wasn't too cold but also not too lead-y, deemed "passable" by my parents, 7/10.

Now, the 5100 is where things got good. The very last fountain, the very top of our beloved Mackenzie. Seeing the model of the 4100 and 4400 blocks gave us hope, as the other ones were at least cold. We pushed the button on the fountain, and finally, a beautiful stream spewed forth. And it was cold. Oh so cold. Finally after all our searching we found it, a source of good water in Mackenzie. This water fountain is on top directionally and also in rating. My dad pointed out that it kinda smells like vomit right at the spout but honestly at that point I could care less. We found a good fountain. 9/10 just don't smell while drinking and you're fine.

Although Mackenzie has some famously bad water, it is nice to know that there is at least one good water fountain amongst the lead-filled sources. 
If you have chess skills, rest assured




DESoc

CIDSA


Look, I know they exist because I've heard them be brought up around the block and at both of the &Design's GMs, but for the love of god I can't find

DIVERSITY IN ENGINEERING CONFERENCE

My Main Takeaway

ello! My name is Holly and I had the wonderful opportunity to attend Western University's conference on diversity engineering in November. I was really lucky to be able to attend a multitude of sessions hosted by extremely intelligent, well spoken, experienced people who lots of perspectives and insight found valuable. very

A lot of the sessions during the weekend focused on data biases, design biases and EDI issues in the workplace. For example, in the realm of automotive safety, crash test dummies and seat belts are designed for male bodies, which significantly increases the risk of fatalities for women in car accidents. Another example is in the healthcare industry, where pulse oximeters that measure blood oxygen levels are less accurate for individuals with darker skin tones, as the technology relies on light absorption, which can be affected by melanin. The impact of this is of course a lesser level of healthcare for BIPOC patients.

There were also sessions centered around the biases found in AI.

A significant issue is sampling used to train AI lacks diversity. This results, of course, in bias or unfair decisions and generating information that excludes marginalizes certain groups. This is particularly concerning as AI

Now, I've overheard / participated bias, which arises when the dataset in conversations with people who think talking about EDI issues is a waste of time. I've heard that people believe it is just common sense, how they believe they already know how to treat everyone equally and how to be

increasingly integrated inclusive. I believe that the most into a very wide range of applications, amplifying societal impact.

important reason why we must be constantly talking about EDI is because we all need to implement these principles to have the best chance at making a difference in the world with our engineering degrees.

I approached this conference as someone who is extremely passionate about protecting the environment and the people who are most affected by climate change. So of course I enjoyed and found value in learning about EDI issues in design. However, I think the real EDI issue we all need to be comfortable talking about is how disproportionately bad climate change is affecting marginalized groups right now and much worse it's going to get.

The sessions I enjoyed the most were the ones that talked about reconstructing the engineering curriculum to include Indigenous voices who are underrepresented in engineering and to have the curriculum be more focused on sustainability. To have engineers thinking globally about environmental issues since soon climate change will become so destructive we won't be able to think about anything else. It reinforced to me the idea that current engineering students who are going to be a huge deciding factor on whether our planet is going to survive or not need to be educated diverse range of social issues.

The idea of even beginning to uproot our society, (which is disgustingly based on colonialism, capitalism, and exploitation) feels absolutely impossible to tackle. However, the radical change is going to have to come through uplifting voices and diversifying our teams of people, since the issues we are going to be facing will incredibly multi-faceted.

THE MOST UNDERRATED DESIGN TEAM

Arch Eng III

Shelby, and we're both 3rd year archeng. We're here to talk about the almost entirely unknown, wildly underrated, and, in our completely unbiased opinion, awesomest design team: the APT-PETC Student Design-Build competition. While we realize that this name may not inspire much enthusiasm, we promise this is worth a read. Especially the civil department students. Keep reading. This is cool.

A QUICK OVERVIEW OF THE COMPETITION:

It alternates every year between a timber bridge or a masonry arch, this past year being the bridge. The competition is divided into three phases over nine months. The first phase is pretty much "hey this bridge meets your requirements" and they say "yep cool welcome to the competition." The second phase is a structural and heritage report for your bridge. If your team makes it to phase 3, you get to go to the APT-PETC conference, which is THE heritage conference in North America. All the hip heritage people go. This year it was in Montreal. At the conference, you assemble a scale model of your bridge and present your report with solutions to some additional conservation problems in front of a panel of judges.

TL:DR: Troitsky for history nerds.

Our team had three undergrads in civil and arch eng, two recent grads (both students when the team started so were still eligible. Don't let graduation stop you from joining), and two PhD students. Our faculty advisor was the man himself, Jack Vandenberg, and our industry advisor was Natalie Smith from John G. Cooke and Associates.

We picked the Powerscourt bridge, a covered bridge in Quebec, near the American border. It was built in 1861 and has national and provincial historic site designations. It is also very pretty.

Our phase 2 report scored top marks (we beat Columbia which is still kinda wild, cuz they're Columbia). We were



told by the judges that it was better than some reports they've seen from licensed engineers. CCDP was good for something, miracles do happen!

For our research, we got to go to site to take measurements, perform a condition assessment, and talk to the local heritage society and the head carpenter from a previous project. With the help of the CIMS lab, we were also able to use a 3D camera and a Faro laser scanner to put together a point cloud of the bridge. It's actually so sick. We used that point cloud to do our CAD drawing package. The structural analysis side of the report was done using FEM software and hand calcs.

Then we started on our scaled model, built entirely in Jack Vandenberg's driveway over the span of a week and a half-ish. Another cool thing is that the whole bridge was built of heritage old growth pine, donated to us by The WoodSource. Some of the leftover pieces of the bridge are currently strung up on our Christmas tree.

We weren't able to get to many of the sessions with competition schedules, but PETC did a good job of providing the students with networking opportunities. We did get to see the keynote, held in a heritage church, about the reconstruction of the Notre Dame cathedral. 10/10 would recommend. For the competition part, the bridge

build is done first. Our bridge had 177 unique members (a nightmare to build in a time crunch) and held the max specified amount of 500 lb, with a total deflection of 10 mm. We had the highest strength to weight ratio of any team. Go efficient structural design!

The closing ceremony was held in another heritage church, but this one has been structurally beefed up to support circus acts. It was all amazing and a little mind-blowing to see the different acts. It did feel a bit like a fever dream to see a lady with a disco ball head descend from a heritage church ceiling like some sort of alien apparition.

Even though we didn't win the overall competition, we gained a ton of technical knowledge as well as improved our soft skills like presentations, networking, and report-writing. We talked to people from just about every heritage-related field, from carpentry to archaeologists to US State

Department planners, and got to listen to research and talks from top heritage professionals in the world. All basically for free.

OUR TAKEAWAYS FROM THIS DESIGN TEAM:

- Carleton's arch eng program is super highly regarded in the heritage community. An absurd amount of the emerging professionals at the conference were arch eng grads
- Dowels have tolerances. If they don't fit and you hammer them in anyway, they will fracture very important wood pieces
- Unrelated: test your dowel sizes
- Jack Vandenberg's driveway does not get sun in the afternoon and you will be freezing and you will get sick
- Dropping f-bombs into the mic in front of a panel of judges does not make a great presentation
- People want to talk to students!
 All you have to do is say hi. Knock and the door shall be opened
- You can be 60 and a respected professional engineer and stil get

hammered on a dance floor to ABBA

- The heritage community is a really close-knit group who genuinely want each other to succeed. As someone put it, "even if we don't get the job, we're not upset because we know it's going to the best engineers, because they care and they're knowledgeable."
- Preservation problems shouldtake at least 7 minutes in your presentation no matter what the competition guidelines say
- Wearing your flightsuit to non- undergad conferences makes the alumni really happy
- Wood checks become a structural issue if they are more than 1/3 of the way through the beam. If it goes all the way through, it is no longer a check, but a fracture

YOUR TAKEAWAYS FROM THIS ARTICLE:

- Civils, arch enges, and enviros: read your department emails. There is useful stuff in there, like super cool heritage design teams that you really want to be a part of
- Conservation is a complex field because it deals not only with the technical skills needed to keep existing buildings safe, but also the often loaded histories of a building, the land, and the people involved

Thank you for making it through the article (if you did). We realize this is a fairly niche area of interest, not everyone's favourite. If you're not interested it's because you're a loser. owdy C-ENG! It's ya boy, Vijay again, back with just a recipe for lemon cheesecake. You must be wondering "Why cheesecake?" Because I like cheesecake - it tastes good and it's the one cake I think I can make better than box mixes. *red buzzer noises* Why are you questioning what I decide to bake in my free time anyway, wise guy? If you wanted an article about baking notcheesecakes, maybe you should have submitted your own recipe to the Iron Times! (Definitely not Rayvel here suggesting you submit an article for March) Mayhaps you should have even become an Iron Times



columnist and write all the damn notcheesecake articles you could ever • dream of for the rest of your career!

Anyway, no two recipes this time -I'm sleepy, and I'll be honest I kinda messed up the second one (a rum cake) in my hubris because I thought I could do this in a sheet pan and not a bundt pan. Nope, the baking gods smote me for such audacity and it ended up falling apart while trying to get it out of the pan (as seen in the picture featuring Beck). Tasted good, but I think I'll try it again in a bundt pan before it ends up in the Iron Times. Anyway, on to the recipe!

Lemon Cheesecake

Servings: can serve about 12 people or one very hungover engineer ain't that just all engineers

<u>Ingredients</u>

Graham Cracker Crust

- 1 and 3/4 cups graham cracker crumbs (14 full sheets of graham crackers)
- 5 tbsp melted unsalted butter
- ½ cup granulated sugar

Cheesecake Filling (optional part of the cheesecake)

- 32 ounces full-fat brick cream softened cheese, to temperature (approximately 4 box 6. While the crust is pre-baking, packages of cream cheese)
- 1 and 1/4 cups granulated sugar
- 1 tbsp lemon zest (takes 1 lemon, pack zest into the spoon)
- ½ cup fresh lemon juice (3-4 lemons), at room temperature
- 1/3 cup sour cream or plain yogurt, room temperature
- 1 tsp pure vanilla extract
- 3 large eggs, at room temperature 7. unless your room is -12 celcius

Lemon Curd Topping (Optional)

- 4 large egg yolks (for thicker lemon curd, replace 2 egg yolks for 1 whole egg)
- ²/₃ cup granulated sugar
- 1 tbsp lemon zest (about 1 lemon)
 - 1/3 cup fresh lemon juice (about

- 2-3 lemons)
- 1/8 teaspoon salt or like 8 grains
- 6 tbsp unsalted butter, softened to room temperature and sliced into 9. small cubes or dodecahedrons

<u>Instructions for Lemon Cheesecake</u>

- 1. Adjust an oven rack to a lowermiddle position with your bare hands and preheat the oven to convection setting if available.
- If starting with full graham crackers, use a blender or food processors to grind into fine crumbs
- Combine 1 and 3/4 cups graham cracker crumbs with 1/4 cup of sugar, and stir until combined; then stir in the 5 tbsp melted butter. End result should have a sandy texture.
- Pour into a 9-inch springform pan and press gently into the bottom and sides of the pan; you are aiming to pat the mixture down so it's no longer crumbly, but not so much so it becomes impossible to remove the cake when it's baked.
- 5. Toss into the oven like you're throwing the last pitch at a sold out baseball game and pre-bake the graham cracker crust for 10 minutes.
- use a food processor (if its an x64 or ARM processor you might want to update the firmware before continuing...) or blender to combine the 1 and 1/4 cups granulated sugar with the 1 tbsp lemon zest; should take 10-12 pulses to break down the zest. This is your lemon sugar.
- Then using a handheld or stand mixer mixer? ninja? fortnite?, 15. Remove the oven from the with the lemon sugar on mediumhigh speed until the mixture is smooth and creamy - this takes about 2 minutes. I once witnessed a man beat the cheese by hand so fast it turned back into the cow it came from.

- 8. Add ½ cup lemon juice, ⅓ cup sour cream, and 1 tsp vanilla into the mixture, on a medium-high speed until fully combined.
- On medium speed, add the 3 eggs one at a time, beating in each addition until blended. Stop mixing after the last egg is mixed in - over-mixing can result in the cheesecake deflating and cracking during cooling.
- 350°F/177°C/810°R/450K, on a 10. By this point, the crust should have been pre-baked removed from the oven; wrap the springform pan in tin foil - you are aiming to wrap it so no water is able to contact the pan and get absorbed by the cheesecake. springform pan in the tin foil, uh yeah i sure hope it does...
 - 11. Pour cheesecake filling into the springform pan - use a spatula to smooth it out.
 - 12. Prepare a water bubble bath using boiling water; place the springform pan into a large roasting pan, and fill the roasting pan until there is an inch of boiling water.
 - 13. Place in the oven and bake for 55-70 minutes or until the center is set. You can determine this by tapping the side of the pan; you are looking for the middle to have a slight wobble and the surface of the cheesecake to move as one - if the surface ripples it's underbaked, and it's a completely set it's overbaked. If the top of the cheesecake browns too quickly and you aren't a fan of that, you can tent with tin foil half-way through the baking time.
 - 14. Turn off the oven and open the oven door - allow the cake to cool for over an hour.
- beat the 32 oz of cream cheese oven and cool the oven to room temperature, and then refrigerate the oven for 4 hours or overnight. You can apply any toppings (such as the lemon curd) once chilled. optionally, remove the oven from the cheesecake before refrigeration and apply toppings

<u>Instructions for Lemon Curd</u> (Optional)

- 1. This portion of the recipe is typically done with a double boiler if you have one, great! This will be ever so slightly easier. If you don't own one, which you definitely didn't, the best equivalent is a heat proof glass bowl over a saucepan of simmering water or two separate industrial boilers- you'll be cooking in the bowl.
- 2. Fill the sauce pot with 1-2 inches, which is massive by the way, of water, and bring to a boil reduce the heat to low to keep the water simmering.
- 3. Add the eggs, ²/₃ cup granulated sugar, ¹/₃ cup lemon juice, and ¹/₈ tsp salt to the bowl *if you feel like it*.
- 4. Using a whisk, whisk until completely blended, then **CONTINUE** TO **WHISK** (DON'T STOP OR THE EGGS WILL CURDLE!!!!! SCRAMBLED EGGS DO NOT TASTE GREAT ON TOP OF CHEESECAKE!!!!!) as the curd cooks and thickens - this process takes about 10 minutes. If the curd isn't thickening, turn up the heat.

- 5. Remove from heat and whisk the sliced butter into the curd. The butter should melt from the heat of the curd as you whisk. *If your butter is cold you can use the microwave for 80-100s on high to warm up the butter (foolproof).*
- 6. Pour curd into a jar or bowl, and chill to allow the curd to thicken further (turns out the curd is supposed to chill, not me) if you wish to prevent a skin from forming during cool, place plastic wrap directly on top of the curd.
- 7. The curd is ready to be used once



- it's chilled I left mine in the fridge for about half the time of the cheesecake's bake time. you can also hide it in your worst enemies fridge for months and let it spoil (:<.
- 8. And there's my cheesecake fresh out of the oven! As you can see, it was brown on the top because I didn't give it as much attention as I should have, but that didn't affect the taste negatively. Further, the skin is a little cracked on top since I kinda messed up on the tin foil tenting and had the tin foil touch the surface of the cheesecake. But overall, it tasted pretty great!

A few words of advice for this recipe; for one, IS THIS A MHA REFERENCE!?!! Ι strongly recommend letting the ingredients come to room temperature before beginning. My award for using the cream cheese straight from the fridge was wrestling with my hand mixer, before opting to break apart the bricks of cream cheese with a potato masher in utter frustration. Also, my point on not packing the graham cracker crust too much is pretty important - I had to fight to remove my cheesecake from the springform pan afterwards. But thanks to all might, he made me the greatest hero!



If you aren't a fan of the lemon flavoured cheesecake filling or deez nuts deez, you can neglect the lemon zest and most of the lemon juice (like how your father neglected your zesty ass) to make the classic cheesecake. Instead, you will need 1 cup of sour cream instead of the 1/3 cup in the recipe, 1 cup of sugar instead of the 1 and ½ cup, and it is optional but recommended to still include 2 tsp of lemon juice. The lemon juice is there to help thicken the filling, and curdle the dairy to produce a firmer texture - not enough is present to be tasted. I've made both cheesecakes, and I can attest to the fact I love cheesecake and I would die eating cheesecake.

These resellers would either charge hundreds for a new booster box (containing 36 individual packs and selling for roughly 180\$ CAD at market) or in the more popular scenario, break up the boxes



themselves to sell the individual high worth cards for anywhere 5\$ to thousands each, while also commonly streaming their openings online to drum up even more money just from the act itself. This started an

all too common self eating cycle, of streamers cracking packs on stream, gathering more interest in the hobby, having people purchase desirable cards at eye watering prices, bringing in more influencers to either talk about the trends of increasing sales or to promote an avenue for profit themselves, bring more people to hoard the cards available for purchase and then to return to cracking again for longer as to bring in more views and money. Now we arrive at the present time, where there are currently 3 highly desirable sets. The 151, which is only focused on the original 151 Pokémon that heavenly leans into the nostalgia market has been desirable for the last two years its been in print, with this latest wave of releases being a final run for the series. This is followed by Surging Sparks, the most recent release which featured an incredibly high amount of Illustrated Rare cards, cards which ditch the usual frame and format of TCG cards and instead mainly focus on art and are typically cheaper compared to less

common and more traditional Secret Rare cards which often also fall into the realm of a 'full art card'. The 3rd set is not even out yet, but is basically expected to sell out within minutes of its release at all stores, Prismatic Evolutions. Prismatic Evolutions is mainly focused on the eeveelutions and contains truthfully some jaw droppingly beautiful cards, the issue comes from the fact that scalpers will be far more successful in finding all of the desirable cards than joe schmo will, and those individual cards will be priced so much higher than other similar examples due to a desire for collections to complete the 9 card set of Secret Illustrated Rares. We have in fact already seen this play out exactly when the Japanese version of the same series, Terastal Festival hit stores last month and has been so completely sold out, with individual SIRs going for hundreds of dollars, while worth noting that Japanese language cards typically are priced a few notches down from their English counterparts, so it is scary to imagine what pricing

will become on those cards so quickly.

It goes without saying that this economic model for a hobby is not in any way self sustaining. The prices of 151 have not been increasing quite as sharply as many expected up to the end of its printing running with the most desirable cards only in the realm of a few hundred dollars. It also seems that the community in its entirety with the exception of online sellers and scalpers (with even youtubers and influencers on the correct side) in praying for the collapse of this system and for prices to both drop much more and also become far more stable during a production run unlike our current issues. I for one, can not wait till the scalpers get their comeuppance.






